- Identify safe working conditions.
- Utilize non-verbal techniques to safely defuse and control aggressive or violent behavior.
- Use TEAM Personal Safety
 Principles to avoid injury if
 behavior escalates to a physical
 level.
- Employ techniques for afterevent documentation and debriefing.

Designed for individuals who may encounter violent behavior, this training provides the knowledge and skills needed to protect your patients and yourself. Both the Essentials and Advanced Techniques for Effective Aggression Management (TEAM®) trainings are being offered in a four-hour class to enhance your culture of safety and meet annual workplace violence training requirements.
