"Thriving Under Pay for Value: Why Clinical Quality Should Be Your Core Business Strategy" 1:15-2:30 p.m.



Brent C. James, MD, M.Stat Clinical Professor, Department of Medicine, Stanford University School of Medicine; Senior Advisor, Health Catalyst

Rapid cost growth continues to accelerate the already challenging pace of health care delivery change. There is a light at the end of the tunnel, though: In 2010, an Institute of Medicine (IOM) expert panel estimated that a minimum of 30 percent, and probably over 50 percent, of all money spent on health care delivery is waste – non-value adding from a patient's perspective. Some estimates put waste levels even higher, exceeding 65 percent.

Waste extraction offers financial opportunities that are at least two orders of magnitude larger than traditional revenue enhancement approaches, both in terms of total financial opportunity and return on investment. Dr. James will divide waste into categories that link directly to operations, with examples of significant real gains that some groups have been demonstrably achieved. Linking waste categories to payment methods lays a foundation for strong strategies to transition into an emerging "pay for value" future. (1.25 ACHE qualified education credits)

"A Great Leader is Not What You Think" 10-11:15 a.m.



Sam Walker Leadership Columnist, The Wall Street Journal; Author, "The Captain Class"

Most people believe leadership is a God-given skill bestowed on the few; a combination of raw talent, charisma, passion, social dominance and extroversion. Many of us use this image to measure our own leadership potential.

By spending 11 years traveling the world to study the 17 greatest dynasties in sports history, Walker found that we've got it all wrong. The only thing that unified these teams was the presence of a very specific type of captain. These men and women were rarely "obvious" leaders and came from different backgrounds with varying personalities and skill levels. What united them is that in tough situations, when their teams needed to be led, they all used the same seven behavioral tactics to pull them through. Their greatness was a matter of making the right choices.

Using colorful examples from some of the most pressuresoaked moments in sports history, Walker will explain how these principles translate to business: not only how they can help CEOs become stronger leaders, but how they can make better hires, forge better teams and drive lasting excellence working with their seconds. Brent C. James, MD, M.Stat, is known

internationally for his work in clinical quality improvement, patient safety and the infrastructure that underlies successful improvement efforts, such as culture change, data systems, payment methods and management roles. He is a member of the National Academy of Medicine (formerly known as the Institute of Medicine) and participated in many of that organization's seminal works on quality and patient safety.

Dr. James is a Fellow of the American College of Physician Executives; Senior Fellow at the Institute for Healthcare Improvement (IHI); Senior Advisor at the Leavitt Group; and Senior Advisor at Health Catalyst. He also holds faculty appointments at Stanford University School of Medicine, Harvard School of Public Health, University of Utah David Eccles School of Business and the University of Utah School of Medicine.

He has been honored with a series of awards for quality in health care delivery, and for 8 of the first 9 years it existed, he was named among *Modern Physician*'s "50 Most Influential Physician Executives in Healthcare." He was named among the "100 Most Powerful People in Healthcare" (*Modern Healthcare*) for over 5 consecutive years and among *Modern Healthcare*'s "25 Top Clinical Informaticists."

**Timothy Naftali** is an associate clinical professor of history and public service at New York University (NYU). He is a presidential historian and a graduate of Yale with a doctorate in history from Harvard. Naftali and Russian academic Aleksandr Fursenko wrote the path-breaking "One Hell of a Gamble: Khrushchev, Castro and Kennedy," 1958-1964, and "Khrushchev's Cold War," the latter winning the Duke of Westminster's Medal for Military Literature in 2007 and inclusion on Foreign Affairs' 2014 list of the ten best books on the Cold War. As a consultant to the 9/11 Commission, Naftali wrote a history of U.S. counterterrorism, later published as "Blind Spot: The Secret History of American Counterterrorism." He has also written "George H. W. Bush, on the Nation's 41st president."

Naftali came to NYU after serving as the founding director of the federal Richard Nixon Presidential Library and Museum, where he drew positive national attention for curating its Watergate Gallery. Naftali, whose work has appeared in *The New York Times, The Los Angeles Times, Slate* and *Foreign Affairs*, is also seen regularly in television documentaries. Most recently, he was featured in CNN's "The Seventies, The Eighties and Race for the White House," and in the PBS documentaries, "Dick Cavett's Watergate," "Dick Cavett's Vietnam" and "The Bomb." **Sara Ross** is a senior advisor and the former vice president and global head of innovation, research and training at the Institute for Health and Human Potential (IHHP), where she spent a decade studying and teaching the neuroscience of emotional intelligence. Building on this work, she established the research collaboration hub, BrainAmped, dedicated to decoding the science of leadership and vitality to create happier, healthier and more human-focused workplaces.

Ross has worked with thousands of leaders from all levels, across multiple industries including Fortune 500 companies such as New York Life Insurance, Rogers and Allstate, tech companies such as Adobe, health care organizations like the University Health Network and Edwards Lifesciences, marketing agencies such as Environics, financial firms such as PricewaterhouseCoopers, Scotiabank and BMO. Through IHHP, she also taught at Smith College's Women's Executive Leadership Program and worked with the NBA leadership team of the Orlando Magic.

In her tenure with IHHP, Ross helped launch their New York bestselling book "Performing Under Pressure" and contributed to the leadership development program for senior female executives – "Women Performing Under Pressure." She remains a head faculty member, coaching and certifying enterprise leaders from across the globe in IHHP's flagship program, "The Science of Emotional Intelligence."

**Sam Walker**, *The Wall Street Journal*'s leadership columnist, is the author of "The Captain Class," named one of the best business books of the year by *The New York Times, CNBC, Strategy + Business, Amazon.com, The Globe and Mail* and *Sports Illustrated*. A former sports columnist and deputy page-one editor at the *Journal*, Walker was the founding editor of the paper's prizewinning sports pages. He is a two-time champion of Tout Wars, the elite fantasybaseball competition he chronicled in his bestselling 2006 book, "Fantasyland." Walker works as a leadership consultant and keynote speaker.
