Overview

The 2019 CHA Patient Safety Leadership Congress will focus on innovations, ideas and debates around high-value health care. The program will highlight the changing role of patient safety and quality and its broadened focus to include high-value care and affordability; how to reduce low-value care and care variation; hospital success stories in a “How Did They Do That?” session; how to build a culture of data-driven cost and quality improvement; utilizing data to identify opportunities to improve health care value; and new leadership mental models to successfully deliver value-based care.

- Examine the expanding role of patient safety and quality that now includes improving quality, enhancing patient experience and reducing costs
- Differentiate between high-value and low-value care, including care variation and unwarranted care

- Interpret data and utilize data analytics to identify target areas for reducing care variation while increasing value
- Explore new mental models and leadership traits to improve care, drive higher levels of performance and reduce costs
