**CO's CURE: Hospital Medicine and Inpatient Family Medicine**

These hospitalist guidelines for pain, sedation, respiratory and non-respiratory therapies. The clinical judgement when applying these guidelines, which are a replacement for a traditional order, is left to the skill and training of the individual clinician. Whenever possible, they are phrased to be consistent with the current, usual, practice, recognized, or common medical practice. Guidelines are based on current evidence, expert opinion, experience and other writings on the topic. Ready for your use as a replacement of a guideline. The following recommendations may not be appropriate for patients on hospice, with acute conditions, recent related prior participation, or other special circumstances.

**ways by Indication continued**

<p><b>Pleuritic Pain</b> For pleuritic pain, provide analgesia. Subcutaneous morphine 1-2 mg q 4-6 hr as needed.</p> <p><b>First-Line Therapy</b> Morphine 1-2 mg IV q 4-6 hr as needed.</p> <p><b>Second-Line Therapy</b> Ketorolac 15 mg IV q 6-8 hr as needed. Considered for use in patients with renal impairment or hepatic impairment.</p>	<p><b>Extremity Pain</b> For extremity pain, provide analgesia.</p> <p><b>First-Line Therapy</b> Ibuprofen 400 mg PO q 6-8 hr as needed. Considered for use in patients with renal impairment or hepatic impairment.</p> <p><b>Second-Line Therapy</b> Ketorolac 15 mg IV q 6-8 hr as needed. Considered for use in patients with renal impairment or hepatic impairment.</p>	<p><b>Musculoskeletal Pain</b> For musculoskeletal pain, provide analgesia.</p> <p><b>First-Line Therapy</b> Morphine 1-2 mg IV q 4-6 hr as needed. Considered for use in patients with renal impairment or hepatic impairment.</p> <p><b>Second-Line Therapy</b> Ketorolac 15 mg IV q 6-8 hr as needed. Considered for use in patients with renal impairment or hepatic impairment.</p>	<p><b>Respiratory Pain</b> For respiratory pain, provide analgesia.</p> <p><b>First-Line Therapy</b> Morphine 1-2 mg IV q 4-6 hr as needed. Considered for use in patients with renal impairment or hepatic impairment.</p> <p><b>Second-Line Therapy</b> Ketorolac 15 mg IV q 6-8 hr as needed. Considered for use in patients with renal impairment or hepatic impairment.</p>
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\* Additional guidelines exist for the following: Abdominal, reproductive, post-operative, dental, and other pain.

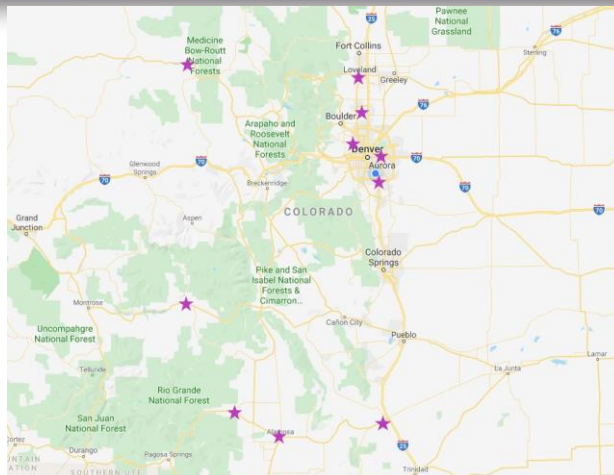

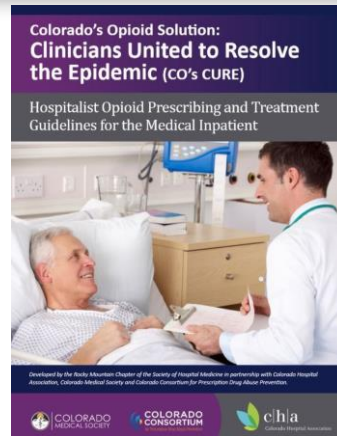
